Transcript Requests

Students should fill out a Transcript Request Form and submit it to the registrar, Ms. Lietzau. In order for transcripts to be mailed before Christmas break, transcript requests must be turned in by December 3. If you have questions, contact Ms. Noffze at ext.3305.

Application Process

Applying to a college is a family project. After completing the application and essay online, gather other items required for admission and prepare envelopes for each school. Put everything together – transcript, fees, essay and/or letters of recommendation in a stamped, addressed envelope.

Tips for a Winning Scholarship Application

1. Apply only if you are eligible. Read the requirements!
2. Complete application in full, follow directions, note deadlines and proofread before mailing!
3. Neatness counts. Type your application or print neatly.
4. Write an essay that makes a strong impression.
5. Make sure your application gets where it needs to go. Put your name and social security number on all pages.
6. Make a copy of the entire packet you submit.
7. Ask for help if you need it.
